

- The addition includes a pair of pavilions with expressed steel frames that act like reveals between panels of granite cladding.
- 2. Glazed corridors at the addition's eastern edge provide visual access to the museum's surroundings. Work on display here, including a 1923 bronze of Diana by Anna Hyatt Huntington and Erwin Hauer-designed screens commissioned by the MFA, are visible from the outside, especially at night.
- 3. A gap between the existing building and the new courtyard, necessitated by seismic codes, allows a 20-foot-wide planted swath that seemingly brings the Fens into the museum's interior.
